
THE PERSISTENT WIDOW

Learning Objectives	The children will learn: ■ The widow did not stop praying for justice and the judge's heart changed. ■ We must pray earnestly and persistently, especially for the return of the Son of God.
Bible Text	Luke 18:1–8

The Persistent Widow



Jesus told a parable to the disciples that illustrated they should always pray earnestly and never feel disappointed.

"In a certain city there lives a judge. He is not a believing man. He does not fear God, and neither does he respect man. A widow came to him and pleaded, 'Please help me and punish the one who has wronged me.'

The judge did not do anything.

However, after the widow left, this judge was very troubled. He did not stop thinking about her.

Finally, he said to himself, 'I do not fear God or respect man. Yet this widow continues to bother me with what happened to her. If I do what she wants, she will stop bothering me. If I do not, she will not stop and I will become very tired."

So the Lord said, "Will God not help His own people who cry to Him day and night for help?

I tell you, that He will consider in their favour and do it quickly."

Suggestions for the Teacher

Lead-In

Show the picture to the children. Discuss with them what they see. Ask what she/he may feel.... Let some of the children play the story in a role-play. Instruct them before. Provide disguise / fancy dress, a table, chairs, books....

Lesson Instructions Begin telling the story...

Discuss with the children...

- What is a judge and what does he do? (In a dispute in court, a judge decides the case)
- Who normally goes to him? (Those who ask for justice/help)
- Why does the judge decide to punish the person who wronged the widow? (Because of her persistency)
- What does persistent mean? (You do not stop doing something.)
- What does Jesus teach with this parable? (If we pray persistently, God answers prayers.)

Have the children repeat...

- The widow did not stop praying for justice and the judge's heart changed.
- We must pray earnestly, especially for the return of the Son of God.

Real-Life Application (explain the following)

- Children always ask their parents for something. They do not always get what they want.
- Likewise, our prayers are not always answered. We do not know why
