
PETER DENIES JESUS

Learning Objectives	The children will learn: ■ Peter denied he knew Christ. Afterwards, Peter felt a great sadness for his actions. ■ We may experience times in our lives when we deny Christ. ■ If we are guided by remorse and repentance, God in His grace offers forgiveness through the sacrifice of Christ.

Suggestions for the Teacher

Lead-In

Show the picture to the children. Discuss with them what they see. Ask what she/he may feel.... Let some of the children play the story in a role-play. Instruct them before. Provide disguise / fancy dress...

Lesson Instructions Begin telling the story...

Discuss with the children...

- What does Peter say to the servant girl about Jesus? ("I do not know him.")
- Why does Peter deny he knows Jesus? (He fears for his live.)
- How does Peter feel after he denied Jesus? (He weeps, he regrets.)

Have the children repeat...

- Peter denied he knew Christ. Afterwards, he felt a great sadness for his actions.
- We may also sometimes deny Christ.
- If we repent, God offers forgiveness through the sacrifice of Christ.

Real-Life Application (explain the following)

- Probably you denied once that you are a new apostolic Christian. (How did you feel?)
- In every situation, we should always stand up for Jesus.
